

3a. Rainbow Fish Art



Materials Needed:

Scaleless fish poster made by student or teacher

Scale-shaped paper

Crayons

Markers

Watercolour paper and paint

Glitter

Tinfoil

Show students a poster of a "scaleless" fish and explain that they are going to work together to make their very own sharing fish.

Hand out a scale to each child at their desks. Tell students to write on their scale a quality that they would like a friend to have, or something they could do for someone in need. It could be a sentence or a word.

Have students decorate their scales with crayons, markers, glitter glue or paint. Add the finished scales to the "scaleless fish."

Watercolour Art:

Have each student paint a piece of watercolour paper with water, then add as many paint colours as they like to create a beautiful rainbow-coloured paper. When they are done, have them draw a fish shape and cut out their "rainbow fish." Students can tear tinfoil and glue it onto their rainbow fish.

Have students write on a fish bubble, or make a caption that reads, "What I could do for someone in need" or "What I can do to make others happy."
